Some countries, including Ireland and Norway, banned its showing, with a few of these bans lasting decades. The film makers used such notoriety to benefit their marketing campaign, with posters stating "So funny it was banned in Norway!" The film was a box-office success, grossing fourth-highest of any film in the UK in 1979 and highest of any British film in the United States that year. It has remained popular since then, receiving positive reviews (the film has 96% "Fresh" on Rotten Tomatoes with this consensus: One of

the more cutting edge films of the 1970s, this religious farce from the classic comedy troupe is as poignant as it is funny...
