If we don't grow continually as a Christian, we build expectations based on other people's experiences instead of our own current position. So too your Heavenly Father relates differently to you as a little child, a young man or as a father in the faith as highlighted in 1 John 2. Each growth phase poses a different degree of intimacy as well as a different level of responsibility in God's Kingdom.
